An introductory shotgun shooting clinic conducted by club members John and Pat Senz is being offered 9 a.m. to 12 noon, Saturday, June 11, This clinic will cover the basics of clay target shooting and shotgun safety. The session will run about three hours and will include live firing of 30 to 35 rounds, using the clubs trap and skeet fields. Cost will be \$60, for instruction, targets, and refreshments.
