**SPRING WORK DETAIL:** We had some good results with about 30-35 members attending our Spring Work Detail on May 1st. The weather was great all day. One group worked on cleaning up storm damage (Trees and Limbs) and pulling out bushes at the rifle range turn-off. Another group installed 4 new benches on the corners of the pistol bays. The Skeet field was also cleaned and edged. Lastly a clay target delivery was unloaded into the storage building.

**NEW TRACTOR:** In order to keep up with grass mowing and other activities the BOT approved the purchase or a new mid size tractor which was delivered to the club on 5/14/05. A second finish mower was approved last year so now as the weather permits we can have to machines available to hopefully keep up with he grass. Last year was a real problem, with many rainy weekends.

**RIFLE RANGES and PISTOL BAYS:** Installed (4)shooting benches on the pistol ranges. The BOT has also approved building a 300 yard range as part of the 200 yard range, a new mound would be built behind and left of 200 yard mound. On days when work is in progress **a Range may be CLOSED** for obvious safety reasons. However, with our current layout, work can be done on one range while allowing use of the others. #### **COMING EVENTS**

An introductory shotgun shooting clinic conducted by club members John and Pat Senz is being offered 9 a.m. to 12 noon, Saturday, June 11, This clinic will cover the basics of clay target shooting and shotgun safety. It will be restricted to club members and their immediate family members. The session will run about three hours and will include live firing of 30 to 35 rounds, using the clubs trap and skeet fields. Cost will be \$60, for instruction, targets, and refreshments. Participants must bring their own ammunition, but do not bring reloaded ammunition for safety reasons. Either 12 or 20 gauge shotguns are acceptable. A minimum of three persons and maximum of 10, but if more people want to sign up, they could do an afternoon Session. Pre-registration and advance payment is required. **Civilian Marksmanship Program:** Civilian Marksmanship program .30-caliber shoot, is set for 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., **Saturday, July 16** on the 200-yard range. Cost is \$10 per person, ammunition included if caliber is .30-06, otherwise shooter must furnish factory rounds only; no reloads. Firearms are any as-issued .30-caliber military firearms including Garands, Springfields, Enfields, Lee-Enfields, Mausers, Russian or other similar firearms.
