

Civilian Marksmanship Program: The club will host a modified John C. Garand Match beginning at 10 a.m., Saturday, Sept.16. The 200 and 300 yard ranges will be used for this activity. The match will require firing at supplied targets at 200 yards and will consist of three stages. This course is a modified version to allow for the use of service rifles such as AR15s. Those shooters participating with a service rifle will be scored in a different category but will fire at the same targets. Shooters must supply their own ammunition and will consist of 35 rounds, including five sight-in rounds.

The cost is \$20 per shooter. For further information, contact Jeff Frischkorn at (440) 257-2483 home or (440) 954-7194 work. Completion of this course will allow participants to buy rifles from the Civilian Marksmanship Program.

Clay Target Shooting clinic conducted by club members John and Pat Senz. An offering of this course is being considered for October 14, 9-12 A.M. and 1-4 P.M.. This clinic will cover the basics of clay target shooting and shotgun safety. It will be restricted to club members and their immediate family members. The session will run about three hours and will include live firing of 30 to 35 rounds, using the club trap and skeet fields. Cost will be \$60, for instruction, targets, and refreshments. Participants must bring their own ammunition, but do not bring reloaded ammunition for safety reasons. Either 12 or 20 gauge shotguns are acceptable. Rifle Range Safety Course: The range safety course, required for all members who wish to use the rifle and pistol ranges, is conducted on the **Second Sunday of every month at 12:00 p.m.** Members need only attend once. A green badge will be issued and then you are welcome to use the ranges.
